


This "Better Together" Journal is a fresh approach that incorporates everything you need to know about the campaign and building plans. We are integrating all generations in this journal. We hope that children and students will pay attention to the opportunity to pray daily and mediate on the scriptures. This is the first time we have devoted space exclusively designed for our young people to participate.

Beginning on Monday, September 9 and lasting through Sunday, October 13, we invite you to join us in daily reading and prayer for our "Better Together" campaign. We not only want to build on our facilities and strengthen our endowment, we also want to build and strengthen our faith.

Asbury has many great traditions, but one of our best is, we are truly an intergenerational congregation. We focus on the needs of our children, students and adults. Since most decisions to follow Jesus come before the age of 18, it makes sense for us to do all within our power to reach our kids for the Lord Jesus. "Better Together" is happening because we want to bring our students back to our main building. They deserve the best we can offer. Having students across the parking lot is confusing to newcomers and creates separation within our congregation. I want our students to rejoin us. By returning them to our main campus, we will be able to transform Venue 68 into a Christian-based development and outreach center. We have strategic partners who we can empower to reach people within our local community in meaningful ways. A third component of "Better Together" is an enhancement to provide better access to our building for our senior adults by creating a north drop-off zone closer to the doors. Finally, by strengthening our endowment, we can help offset future financial obligations.

The Lord willing, I will be speaking for five consecutive Sundays (September 15 – October 13). I ask for your prayers and presence during this series. We have limited opportunities for such a time as this. We are praying to make the most of these moments. The five messages, "Follow the Leader, Seek the Lord, Be Strong in the Lord, Bless the Lord and Dedicate to the Lord," follow the biblical text of the Israelites building the Temple. King David wanted to hand off a great legacy to his son, Solomon. The intent was to bring glory to God. I want you to follow the daily readings showing what others have done when faced with opportunities and challenges.

We share the same intent. We want God to be glorified. We are Helping Others Follow Jesus because we believe He is the key to life, both here, now and eternally. This is our opportunity to invest in God's kingdom through Asbury.

Join with me in praying this will be one of the most significant works of God in the wonderful history of our congregation. I hope this journal will be a useful tool in discerning what God is calling you to do to help us be "Better Together."


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


FLOOR PLAN - Asbury Student Center

LOBBY AREA - Asbury Student Center






PATIO AREAS - Asbury Student Center

Monday, September 9, 2019 | 1 Chronicles 28:1-8

In "A Tale of Two Cities," Charles Dickens wrote "It was the best of times, it was the worst of times. It was the age of wisdom, it was the age of foolishness." King David had been wise, heroic and had known success. He had also tasted depression and crushing despair. Let's give him credit – he finished well. He lined things up to the best of his ability and he ended with a great legacy. As Israel's leader, it was time for him to speak to his nation. He empowered his successor (his son, Solomon) to follow well.

Noted author, John Maxwell, claims, "Leadership is **influence**." Effective leadership inspires us to do more than we could on our own. Leaders cast vision. They plan and prepare. Leaders unite people. Without leadership, we do our own thing. "Where there is no prophetic vision the people cast off restraint, but blessed is he who keeps the law." (Proverbs 29:18) The book of Judges concludes with a depressing and chaotic result of the absence of leadership: "In those days, there was no king in Israel. Everyone did what was right in his own eyes." (21:25) Judges is a black hole of "the worst of times."

In his book, "The Leadership Engine," Noel Tichy describes the four dynamics of effective

leadership: Good ideas, energy, values and timing. Good ideas need energy to execute. Ideas and energy deficient in good character destroy. Yet, no matter how smart, energetic and noble, opportunities did not exist had we lived in the Himalayas in the 1400s. Ecclesiastes 3 famously says there is a time for everything to come together.

APPLICATION: Asbury's leadership has prayerfully determined "Better Together" is a great plan. "Better Together" energizes us. Just as King David was able to bring people together to support his initiative, we believe now is the right time to act. We pray for a people like Nehemiah led, who had a "mind to work." We pray for a unified church who, shortly after Pentecost, came together with one heart.

David lined up his son, Solomon, to succeed him as king. He wanted his son to seek God with all his heart and mind. Loving God is the core component for a person of faith. David experienced what happened when his heart turned from God and other affairs caught him. Yet, David ended on a high note. He tried to share that understanding with Solomon.

Every wise leader understands the importance of passing the baton to the next generation. Hezekiah was a good king, yet, he dropped the baton of faith. When told his pride would cause future judgment that would devastate his nation, he callously shrugged his shoulders. "For he thought, 'Why not, if there will be peace and security in my days?" (2 Kings 20:19)

Like the three kings, David, Solomon and Hezekiah, we are so easily distracted. Paul insisted

ollowers of Jesus are to have His mind. He also compared the Christian Ve are in a marathon, not a sprint.	

APPLICATION: It only takes one generation to blow it, so that the next generation is short-changed. Note in our reading from 1 Chronicles the blessing David confers on Solomon is conditional. IF is a tiny word but big doors swing on small hinges. David warns his son that his life and kingdom can go in one of two directions. It is all about the "if" of verse 9. We must "be careful now," too. Generations have invested in us so we might be wise stewards of our faith. We do not have unlimited opportunities to do good. Asbury's leadership believes "Better Together" is our moment - a time worth seizing.

In every facet of life, the pressures leaders face can cause them to lose their nerve. Leaders are sabotaged and triangulated. Leaders can lose their identity by trying to please all the people, all the time. I like the saying, "We have an audience of One." We like to please people, but we are ultimately here to please the Lord. When we forget this truth, we will follow the wrong path.

It would have been easy for the Apostle Paul to have lost his nerve and quit. He did not quit. He put on the whole armor of God. That helped him persevere. However, he took more than a defensive posture. He stood firm. He attacked with the sword of the Spirit. He also stayed strong by the prayers of the saints and the presence of the Holy Spirit.

We are so much stronger when we are not alone. We need previous generations to coach,

train and deploy us. We learn from our wounds and share our wisdom with others. Having wisdom and relationships is a major goal of life. Jesus gave us the Holy Spirit – the "comforter, the counselor." We need the presence of God and the company of other believers. If Christians claim to not need the church, I want to ask, "Then how did you ever hear the gospel?" We are Christians only because others have passed the faith to us. We are commanded to pass it forward, too. We are stronger together.	

APPLICATION: David told his son, Solomon, the same thing Moses told the Israelites when they were about to cross the Jordan under the leadership of his successor (Deuteronomy 31 and Joshua 1). The legacy of faith was to be handed off to the next generation. King Jehoshaphat was referred to with this line: "His heart was courageous in the ways of the Lord." (2 Chronicles 17:6) Wow! What a great line! Be courageous – for the Lord.

Bless the Lord

Monday, September 30, 2019 | **1 Chronicles 29:10-20**

God has lavishly blessed us through Jesus, the Holy Spirit and His church. It is essential we feel blessed by God. "Blessed" is who we are in Jesus Christ. "I am blessed" is our identity. If we do not think we are blessed, we believe we are ignored (at best) or cursed (at worst).

After receiving His grace, we get to return the favor – we can bless the Lord in return. To bless the Lord means to praise God's holy Name. Praise becomes its own love language. Exalting God fills us with gratitude, generosity and joy. It shifts the focus from our limitations to God's surpassing power. Our applause of God becomes the language of heaven. When we bless the Lord, we speak good of Him.

To bless the Lord means to speak and sing. Our words have such power. They reflect what is in our hearts. When we continually speak the praises of God, we are lifted up. I think of one of the managers of a restaurant I frequent who always says when I ask her how she is: "I am blessed and highly favored." In fact, I join with her when she says it. She could answer in a lot of ways – but this is her habit.

We don't just bless the Lord when everything goes our way. Think of Job. After losing all his possessions, his health and his children, he said: "Naked I came from my mother's womb, and nai shall I return. The Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord." (Job 1:21) When Paul was in Philippi (Acts 16) he was beaten with rods and thrown into jail, yet he and Silas were singing hymns and praying while in stocks and chains. Blessing the Lord was at the heart of the early church.	9

APPLICATION: We can develop our affections for God in many ways. Learning to bless the Lord is strategic. It opens our hearts to His love. It removes obstacles and barriers that prevent our hearts from being free. Many Psalms reveal this theme. Blessing God is a frequent language of the converted heart.

Monday, October 7, 2019 | 2 Chronicles 5

To dedicate something means to contribute or consecrate. It means to make a commitment, a gift or a pledge. In the Bible, sometimes people dedicated themselves to the Lord. At other times, they dedicated material objects for the purposes of God. Certain people and objects were set apart for special use. The Bible mentions an altar, silver and gold, the Temple, and a wall in Jerusalem as being dedicated to God. On two occasions when God's people dedicated themselves and their gifts to God, the glory of the Lord appeared in spectacular fashion. The psalmists wanted this glory to last forever. Isaiah and Ezekiel yearned for God's glory. The glory of God is what brought the shepherds in Bethlehem to their knees: "And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them." (Luke 2:9) God initiates. We respond. God is glorified. God's glory fills us with joy. Those who experience the glory of the Lord are truly and completely dedicated to Him. We are so grateful for His favor that we want to return His gifts. We want to offer more than token gifts to the Lord – we want to give significantly.

APPLICATION: Sacrificial giving forces us to choose our priorities. When we love God, we want to give our very best, not our leftovers (Malachi 3). The widow who had next to nothing gave what little she had. Jesus saw it and commended her for it. There are no second stringers in the church. Everyone needs to contribute for the good of their own hearts. Everyone needs to contribute for the common good. Surpassing what is done for individuals and for the community is how our giving glorifies the Lord. Although they vary, we all have gifts to share. As is said, "Not equal gifts, but equal sacrifice." What will you dedicate to the Lord over the next three years for "Better Together"?






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
Devotional: God shows us time and time again through Scripture why it's important to pray. We see Jesus praying regularly throughout His life, during the good times and bad. Jesus showed His disciples, and us, an example for how we should pray using the Lord's Prayer as a guide.


Read Philippians 4:6-7


It says that we should bring our prayers and requests to God in EVERY situation. Is that a little convicting? It is for us. We realize we are quick to tell our friends and family about the different situations we find ourselves in. Whether we are excited, annoyed or sad about the things going on in our lives, we seldom talk to God first. When we do spend time with Him, it's usually to ask for things. How will you be mindful about bringing your prayers, petitions, and thankfulness to God this week?



Sometimes we feel embarrassed to pray out loud because we think we are going to say the wrong thing. God doesn't expect us to say impressive prayers, He just asks us to bring all our worries, desires, fears and thankfulness to Him.











Is faith a hard concept for you to understand? For us, it can be. Faith is believing in something you can't see and sometimes that can be intimidating. When we have faith in God and take His words to heart, we are able to have more courage because we are reminded that He is in **EVERY** situation.

God often times calls us to things that we cannot do on our own. The enemy tries to take our eyes off what God has called us to by making us feel small and insignificant. It makes it easier to step out of our comfort zone when we remember that God promises that He will never leave or forsake us. Despite the lies the enemy tells us, we know that having faith in God can stretch us to our limits at times. However, when faith and courage come together, it can make a lasting impact.

We've learned God doesn't call us to live in our comfort zone. Instead, He challenges us to push through discomfort so that others can know about Him through our actions, words and character. When we have faith in God, we have faith that He will use us, if we let Him. Every small act of obedience to God matters. Sometimes it just takes saying "yes" to doing the small things so that when God asks us to do the big things, we have the courage to do it.

This week, we want you to look for ways you can be courageous and grow in your faith. On the following page, each day, write down an act of courage or kindness you did for someone else. We are challenging you to go outside your comfort zone and do more than pay for someone's meal behind you in the drive thru.

Examples of ways that you can be courageous in your faith: putting on your Instagram story if anyone has a prayer request and faithfully pray for whoever responds, continuously invite the person who sits alone at lunch to join you and your friends, go out of your way to write a note to someone at school about how you see Christ in them, help your elderly neighbor do a task outside and ask them if you can pray for them afterwards, praying for your sibling who is going through a difficult season, etc.

Have courage that you can do uncomfortable things for God. It is amazing to witness how the people's faith around you will grow because of your obedience.

Activity: We want you to write a letter to yourself in the future. Where would you like to see your faith grow by the time the building is built? Keep these letters because we will use them for a project in the new building while it is under construction.

Sometimes generosity can be uncomfortable and it may not always be our first response; however, God can use your generosity to bring Him glory in big ways if you let him.

MONDAY

How can you be generous with your presence this week at home and school? We want to challenge you to come to church on Wednesday night and Sunday this week. Commit to being generous with your time.





TUESDAY

How can you be generous in the ways that you witness to others this week? Who will you intentionally show the Love of Christ to or invite to Church this week? Maybe there has been someone placed on your heart that you know could really use someone encouraging them to come with you.



WEDNESDAY

How can you be generous with your service or time this week? This may be at home, school, in your neighborhood or for a stranger. Get creative and go love people well by serving others.





THURSDAY

How can you be generous with your prayers for others and for Asbury this week? You could maybe choose to not get on social media/video games all day and instead commit to praying for the people around you.



FRIDAY

How can you be generous with your gifts moving into the next week? Gifts are more than just money. They include time, abilities, and talents that God has given you. Start being generous with your gifts today and over this next week and watch how God transforms your thoughts through your generosity.





BIG SACRIFICE

* TAKE OWNERSHIP

We realize that our church is better together than we are on our own. We can make lasting impacts on other people's lives while having fun together too. We know this to be true through the opportunities we get when we serve alongside our friends.

Start brainstorming and planning some ways that you can join with your friends to raise money as a group for the new building. Be creative and think outside of the box for ways to make a difference in the future of Asbury.

Examples of this could be a bake sale, lemonade stand, car wash, color run, cleaning car windows after church on a Sunday Morning, raking leaves, etc.

Can you set a group goal for giving toward the new building?



Monday: Can you sacrifice your own desires this week and give your money to the building campaign. Any time you want to go out to eat this week, get a Starbucks drink, etc. choose to set that money aside and donate it to the future of Asbury Student Ministries. Every small act of obedience leads to immense change in the lives of others. Bring any money raised with you to Church on October 13 during the Youth Service. Any money that you bring on Sunday will enter you in a drawing to win a day with your youth pastor and three friends for a day of fun.

FAITH AND COURAGE Numbers 13-14 In your Discipleship Community, who are the Calebs and Joshuas, those who motivate others in the Community toward faith and courage? What caused Caleb and Joshua's voices to differ from that of the other ten explorers? What did the ten see and hear? What did Caleb and Joshua see and hear? 
